



Dear Parents and Carers,

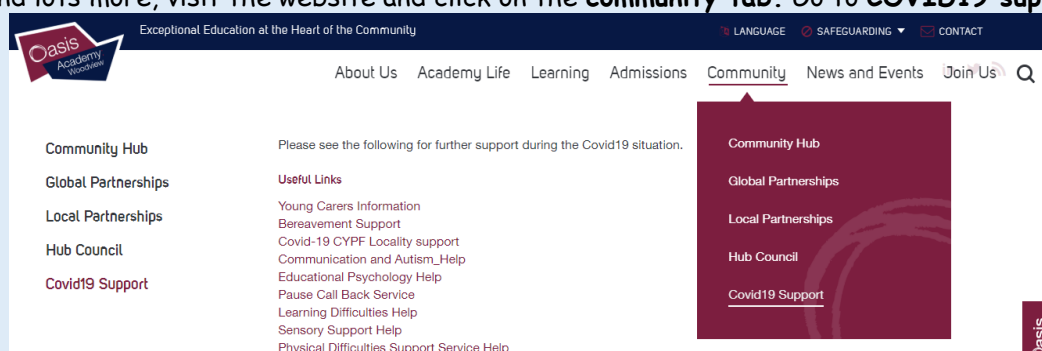
Welcome to the Summer Term Safeguarding Newsletter. Safeguarding the children within our school continues to be at the top of our agenda and is at the core of the work we do.
